




NEIGHBOURHOOD GUIDE

Mississauga Valley

In this Neighbourhood Guide, you'll find out more about the people who live here as well as the schools, parks and recreation facilities, homes, and more.

Mississauga Valley has a consistent population, and is popular with people in their 20s, people in their 30s, people in their 40s, and people in their 50s. Mississauga Valley is located in central Mississauga and residents enjoy quick access to all of the city centre amenities. The area contains a mix of detached and semi-detached homes in addition to some townhomes and condo complexes.

Getting Around in Mississauga Valley

There are 117 transit stops in Mississauga Valley. Rail stations include Cooksville GO. In Mississauga Valley, there are mostly vehicle commuters and a mix of commuting within and outside the city.
