


This neighbourhood has a consistent population, and is popular with people in their 30s, people in their 40s, people in their 50s, and people in their 60s. The Old Milton neighbourhood is a long strip based along Main Street, and running between, roughly, Bronte Rd and Thompson Rd. It is the historic and downtown centre of Milton, with a mix of century homes, wartime bungalows, and more recent homes, mainly single-detached on generous lots. The commercial and service areas feature restaurants, boutiques, a farmer's market, and Town Hall.
