Port Credit

In this Neighbourhood Guide, you'll find out more about the people who live here as well as the schools, parks and recreation facilities, homes, and more.

This neighbourhood has a consistent population, and is popular with people in their 30s, people in their 40s, people in their 50s, and people in their 60s. Port Credit is a small neighbourhood in south central Mississauga, on the shore of Lake Ontario. It is a vibrant community with a beautiful waterfront featuring park lands, a lighthouse, marina, restaurants, cafés, entertainment, events, shops, farmers' market, and other amenities. Housing is a mix of apartment buildings (both rental and condos), townhome condos, bungalows, and larger, very expensive properties.
